PROTECTION OF DOCTOR'S CONSCIENCE RIGHTS: In Nova Scotia, physicians are forced to refer patients for euthanasia (MAID). Thirty-three courageous Christian physicians have told the Nova Scotia Medical Regulator that they cannot abide by this policy. A letter to the Premier and Minister of Health is available at the Church entrance rejecting this policy. Please sign. The letter notes that more than 150,000 Nova Scotians are waiting for a family doctor. If these changes are not made to the college policy, at least thirty-three physicians across the province will be forced to move or to retire early.
