YOUNG SAINTS FOR OUR TIME: Today, (September 7th), Pope Leo will canonize two young people: Blessed Carlo Acutis (his relic was in our diocese last fall) and Blessed Pier Georgio Frassati.

Carlo Acutis was British born but raised in Milan. He is celebrated for his devotion to the Eucharist, his use of digital media to promote Catholic devotion. He was diagnosed with leukemia and died at the age of 15 in 2006.

Pier Frassati died due to polio on July 4, 1925 in Turin, Italy at the age of 24. He was an Italian Catholic activist and a member of the Third Order of St. Dominic. He was dedicated to Social Justice, Catholic Action and the Society of St. Vincent dePaul. He was known for his practice of catering to the less fortunate. He was an avid skier and athlete.

Both canonizations were delayed due to the death of Pope Francis. Acutis was supposed to be canonized the weekend that Pope Francis died and Frassati in July during the Jubilee of Youth.
