

NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION: Tuesday, September 30th is National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The Annual Collection to the Indigenous Reconciliation Fund is next Sunday. This Fund was established in 2022 by the Canadian Catholic Bishops to promote initiatives that foster healing and reconciliation. The 73 Canadian dioceses have been asked to contribute a total of \$30 million over a five-year period. To date, \$21 million has been contributed. The money contributed by our diocese will be returned to our diocese through funding for initiatives that

support Healing and Reconciliation for communities and families, culture and language revitalization, education and community, revitalization, educating indigenous spirituality and culture.

DAY OF CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME: Saturday, October 4th the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at Our Lady of Grace Monastery. Bishop Kirkpatrick will celebrate the recently published Mass for the Care of Creation followed by discussion and the screening of a film on the 10th Anniversary of Pope Francis encyclical Laudato Si on the environment.

MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY: October is the Month of the Holy Rosary. Pope Leo has invited everyone, every day of the month of October to pray the Rosary for peace personally, in the family and in the community. He also announced that a prayer for peace will be held in St. Peter's Square on Saturday, October 11th at 6:00 p.m. It will be the Anniversary of the opening of Vatican Council II.

JUBILEE YEAR 2025: Our Lady of the Rosary Church is one of the churches in the diocese designated as a Pilgrim site during the Jubilee Year. The theme of the Jubilee Year is "Pilgrims of Hope". The intention of the year is to offer all of us an opportunity to be "renewed in hope." The pilgrimage ought to draw us to experience conversation, to transform ourselves to the holiness of God and to deepen our awareness and connection to our God, our faith and ourselves. A plenary Indulgence can be received through visits to any of our Diocesan Shrines: Our Lady of Grace, Monastery, Our Lady of Sorrows, Mabou, Our Lady of Guadalupe, Johnstown, Parish churches and works of Mercy and Penance by participating in Mass, Eucharistic Adoration and the Sacrament of Penance. Our Feast Day, October 7th, Our Lady of the Rosary will be celebrated at 11:00 a.m. Mass with Sacrament of Penance (Individual Confession) at 10:30 a.m.
